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Welcome

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone is an easy to deploy, manage and use conference phone with a large color touch display that delivers graphically rich applications. As a full-feature enterprise-class phone, the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone provides twelve top softkeys supporting up to 48 functions and six bottom softkeys supporting up to 30 functions.

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone features superior sound quality with two optional extension microphones providing extended audio pickup range.

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports MobileLink, a feature that provides seamless mobile integration using Bluetooth wireless technology. MobileLink highlights include the ability to:

- Answer a mobile phone call using your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone.
- Effortlessly move mobile call audio between the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone and your mobile phone.
- Sync your mobile phone's contact list and call log with your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone.

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone also supports exclusive Mitel applications such as:

- MiCollab Meeting Center that provides the list of MiCollab conference calls and enables you to join a call without the need to enter a meeting ID or a PIN code.
- Mitel Mass Notification that enables the phone to receive emergency and other messages and broadcast them in the meeting rooms.

Accommodating today's high speed networks through the Gigabit Ethernet port, the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone also has an environmentally efficient PoE class 3 rating. The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone is one of the most advanced conference IP phones available today.

About this guide

This guide explains how to use the basic features of your new Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone. Not all features listed are available by default. Your System Administrator has the ability to customize many features on this phone. Contact your System Administrator to find out which features and services are available to you on your phone system.

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone shares many features and characteristics of the Mitel 6940 SIP Phone and has a similar user interface. Users of this document may find the Mitel 6940 SIP Phone User Guide complimentary to this guide.

Installation and setup

Cleaning the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone touchscreen

Frequent use of the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone may lead to a dirty screen. To clean the phone screen, Mitel recommends using a super-fine cotton cloth, cotton swab, or microfiber lens cloth made of microfiber suede (preferably the one without sewn hems or similar characteristics that would scratch the surface of the screen). You can use the cloth dry for dusting, polishing and light cleaning, or dampen it (with water only) to deep clean the surface. If using a damp cloth, make sure to use just a little water on the cloth. Too much moisture can cause damage to your phone that could be permanent. If the cloth is dripping or the surface shows water spots after wiping, then you are using too much water on the cloth.

Adhere to the following rules when cleaning the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone screen:

- Do not use any sharp objects including your fingernail.
- Do not rub, touch or tap the surface of the screen with sharp or abrasive items such as a ball-point pen or a screw driver.
- Do not use any type of cleansers including abrasive cleansers.

- Do not use any type of glass cleaner or any cleaner that contains alcohol or ammonia.
- Do not spray any type of cleaner directly on the phone's screen.
- Do not allow any liquid to run down the surface of the touchscreen and under the bezel.
- If using a damp cloth, disconnect power to the phone before wiping the screen.

CAUTION: Use of any type of cleaners, alcohol, ammonia, and/or hard or sharp objects can harm the touchscreen surface and potentially cause transparent conductive film cracks in the screen.

To clean your Mitel 6970 IP Conference phone's touchscreen:

1. Disconnect power to your phone.
2. Retrieve a soft cloth, such as a microfiber cloth.
3. If necessary, dampen the cloth. For regular cleanings, a dry cloth is usually sufficient. For stubborn build-up or for periodic deep cleanings, wet the cloth under a faucet and then wring out until it is just damp.
4. Wipe the screen gently with the cloth making sure to not get any moisture in the sides of the screen. You can also wipe down the entire phone to remove dirt and grime.
5. Allow your phone to completely dry after you are done cleaning. This should only take a few minutes.
6. Reconnect power to your phone.

Note: Keeping your touchscreen clean and free of dirt and fingerprints on a regular basis extends the life of your phone touchscreen.

Protect your hearing

Your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone has a control for adjusting the volume of the speakerphone. Keep the volume at a moderate level because continuous exposure to loud sounds can contribute to hearing loss.

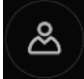
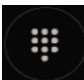

Key overview


The following sections describe the various Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone key functions used to make and manage calls and caller information.



Key description

The following table describes the keys on the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone:

Key	Description
	Goodbye key: ends an active call.
	Directory key: displays a list of company contacts. For more information, see “Updating mobile call history and missed calls” on page 75.
	Dialpad key: opens and closes the dialpad to dial an extension manually.
	Mute key: mutes the microphones so that you are not heard during a call. For more information, see “Muting and unmuting a call” on page 23.

Key	Description
	<p>Volume Up, Volume Down - Adjusts the volume for the ringer and the speakerphone.</p> <p>Press the volume control keys while the phone is ringing to adjust the ringer volume. Pressing these keys during an active call adjusts the volume of the speaker.</p>

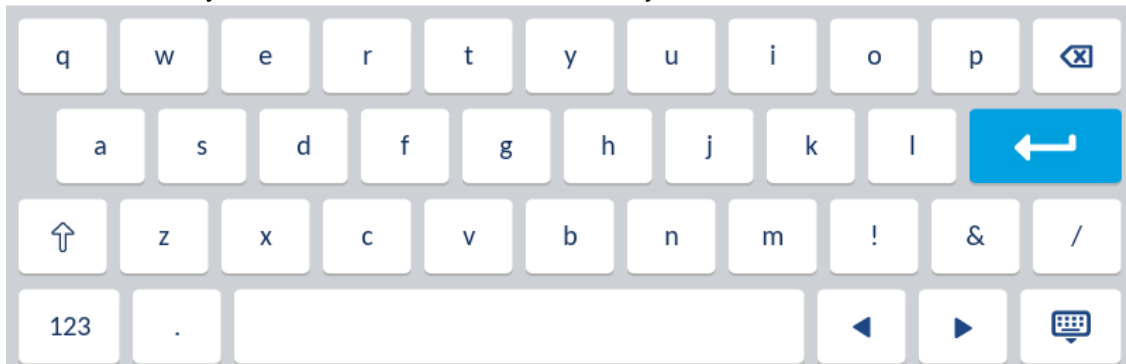
On-screen dialpad

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone has an on-screen dialpad with digits from 0 through 9, a star button (*) and a pound button (#). Buttons 2 through 9 contain the letters of the alphabet. These dialpad buttons can be used to dial a phone number to make a call (see [“Making calls”](#) on page 21) and to enter digits requested by an Interactive Voice Response (IVR) system.

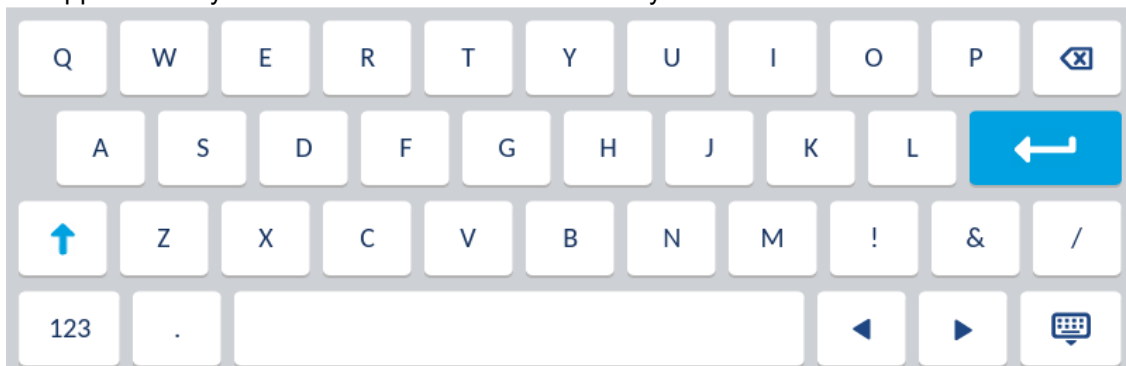
On-screen keyboard

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone uses an on-screen international keyboard for character input. The on-screen international keyboard is automatically displayed in various applications when character input is required.

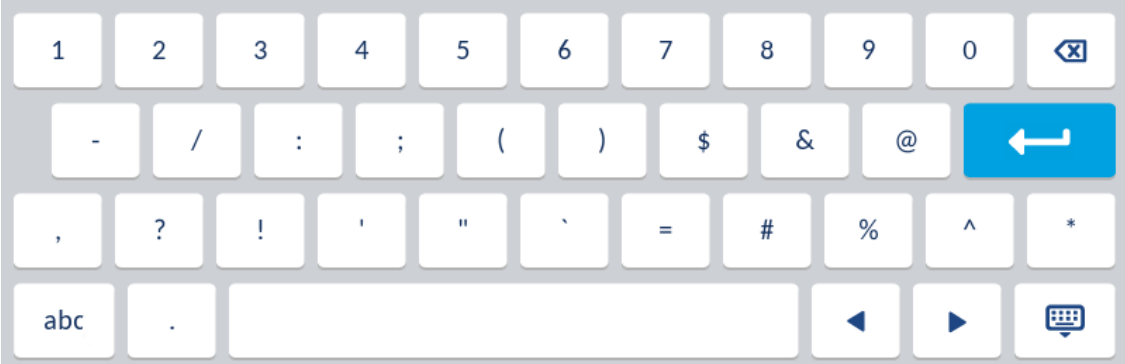
The lower case layout of the on-screen international keyboard is as follows:

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone must be set up and be configured by your system administrator prior to its first use.

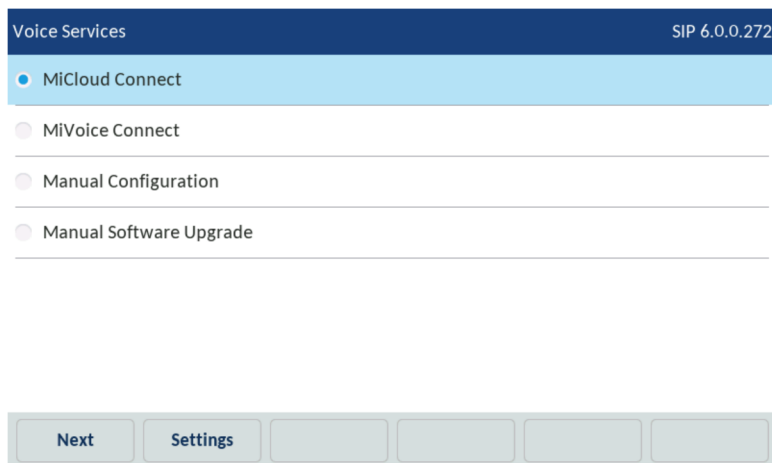
Voice Services

Voice Services can be configured on Mitel 6970 SIP phones to provide remote workers access to the same rich communication capabilities as provided to in-office workers.

After the initial boot-up of the SIP phone, a **Voice Services** screen auto-prompts the user to select an appropriate service.

The user can select from one of the following service options:

- **MiCloud Connect**
- **MiVoice Connect**
- **Manual Configuration**
- **Manual Software Upgrade**



- For MiCloud Connect, enter **User DID** and **Password**.

1. Press the **(Options)** key on the phone to enter the **Options** menu.

4. Make the required changes.
5. Tap the **Save/Register** softkey to save your changes.

UI overview

Navigation

UI navigation is performed using the LCD touchscreen:

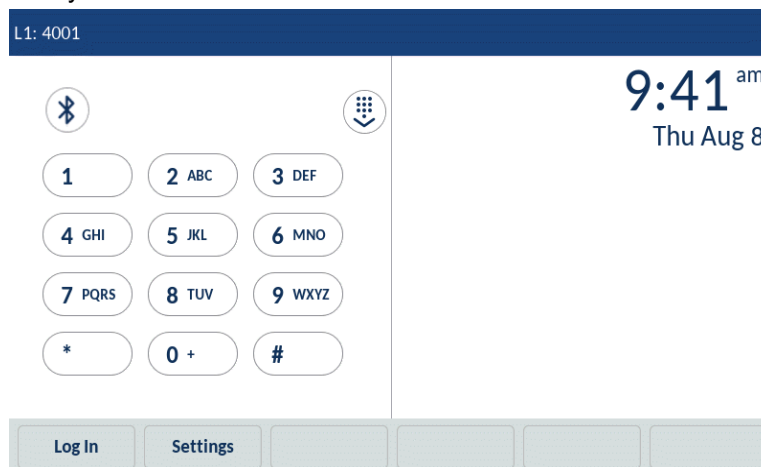
- Swipe left and right in the top softkey area to switch top softkey pages.
- Swipe up and down in the various settings menus as well as the **Directory** application to scroll through the respective list of settings and contacts.
- Tap an item on the screen to select it or perform a corresponding action.

Home screen and Dialpad screen

When the phone has successfully booted up and connected to the network, the phone displays the **Dialpad** screen as a default screen. Once a user has hot-desked into the phone, the default screen becomes the **Home** screen to give instant access to personal speed dials and softkeys.

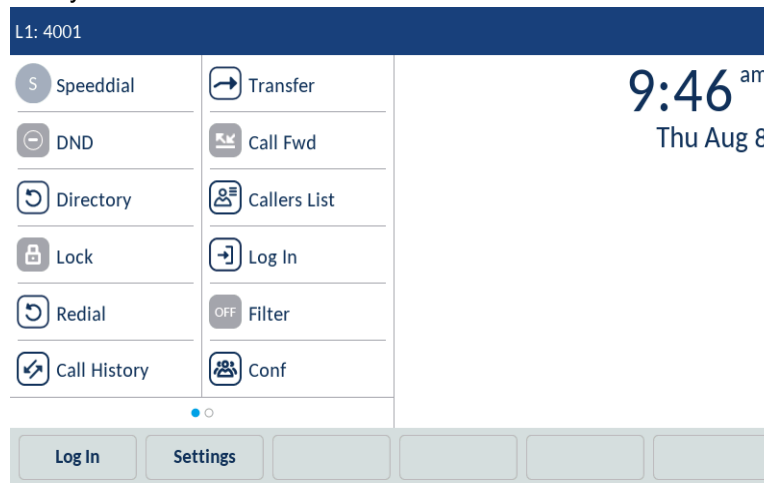
The **Dialpad** screen displays the following elements in an idle state:

- status bar
- on-screen dialpad
- time and date
- Bluetooth icon
- bottom softkeys



The **Home** screen displays the following elements in an idle state:

- status bar
- time and date
- top softkeys
- bottom softkeys



Notes:




1. The default softkeys are configured by your System Administrator and may differ. If you want to add or remove softkeys, contact your System Administrator.
2. Avatars are only available if set up by your System Administrator. If avatars are not available, contact's initials (if available) or a generic avatar are displayed.

Phone and network status indicators

Status icons are displayed on the phone to indicate the status of the phone and network. These icons are displayed on the **status bar**.

The following table identifies and describes the phone status indicators.

Icon	Description
	Missed Calls - The Missed Calls icon is displayed on the status bar screen only when incoming calls have not been received. The number in the red badge at the top-right of the icon indicates how many calls were missed. To access a list of your missed calls, tap the Call History softkey.
	Do Not Disturb - The Do Not Disturb (DND) icon is displayed on the status bar when the Do Not Disturb feature is enabled. When DND is enabled, callers may hear a signal and a "Do Not Disturb" notification is displayed on their phones, depending on the configured setting in the System Administrator Tool. For more information on the DND feature, see "Configuring softkeys" on page 48 .
	Mute - The Mute icon is displayed on the status bar when the Mute key is on. For more information, see "Muting and unmuting a call" on page 23 .

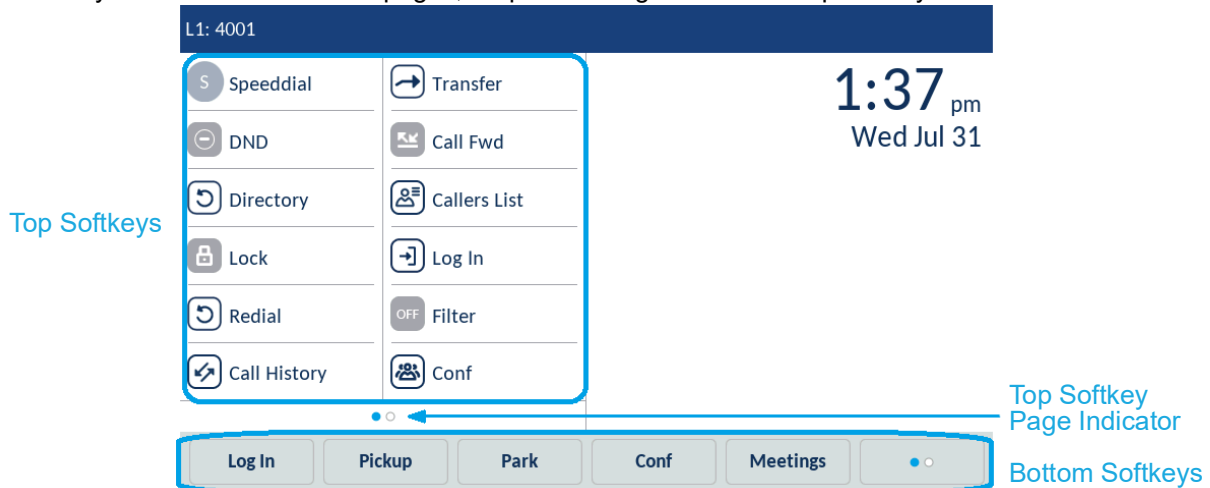
Icon	Description
	Phone Locked - The lock icon displays on the status bar indicating that the phone is in a locked state preventing the phone from being used. For more information, see “Phone Lock” on page 84 .
	Bluetooth Enabled - The Bluetooth Enabled icon displays on the status bar when the Bluetooth functionality has been turned on. For more information, see “Bluetooth” on page 64 .
	Mobile Phone Connected - The Mobile Phone Connected icon displays on the status bar when a mobile phone connection has been detected. For more information, see “MobileLink” on page 64 .

Top and bottom softkeys

Twelve top softkeys supporting up to 48 functions and six bottom softkeys supporting up to 30 functions are accessible on the **Home** screen. You can configure the bottom and top softkeys displayed on the **Home** screen using Web UI if allowed by your system administrator.

The **bottom softkeys** change depending on the state of the phone and are used to perform different functions when the phone is in an idle, connected, outgoing, or busy state.

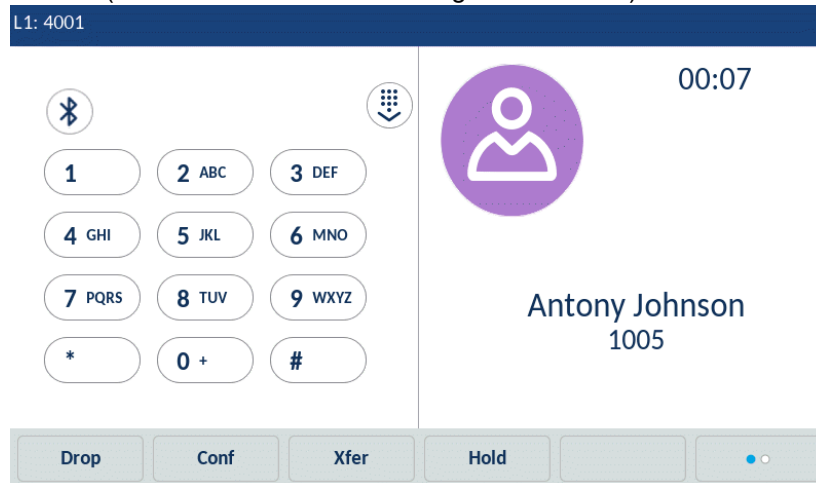
The **top softkeys** are displayed on the **Home** screen. If you have 12 or more top softkeys configured, the top softkey page indicators are displayed at the bottom of the screen. These dots indicate the number of the top key pages and the page you are on. The phone supports up to 4 pages of 12 keys. To access additional pages, swipe left or right within the top softkey area.



Call screen

During an incoming or an outgoing call and during an active call, all the essential information regarding the call is displayed on the screen, including the caller's avatar, name, number, call duration

timer, and current time and date. The bottom softkeys also change allowing you access to more call handling features (such as **Conf** and **Xfer** during an active call).



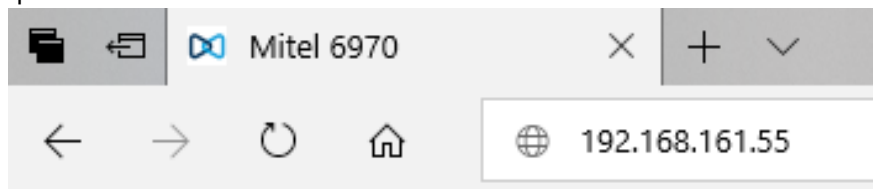
The **Call screen** contains the same information in both Logged Out and Logged In states.

Phone options through the Mitel Web UI

In addition to the IP phone UI options, you can customize options on the IP phone using the Mitel Web UI. In order to access your phone using the Mitel Web UI, you need to know your phone's IP address. To find your IP address, tap Settings > Status > Network. Using the Mitel Web UI

1. Open your web browser, enter the phone's IP address or host name into the address field and press **Enter**.



2. At the prompt, enter your username and password and click **Sign in**.

Note: The softkey functions are configured by your System Administrator and can be different from the list above.


Handling calls

This sub-section describes ways to make and answer calls on the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone, as well as mute and transfer the call. You can handle calls both when you are logged-in and logged out.

Making calls

Dialing a number

1. On the **Dialpad** screen, enter the phone number you wish to call using the dial pad.

Note: When dialing, tap the **Backspace** softkey to delete the last digit entered. To cancel the dialing process, tap the **Cancel** softkey or the  **(Goodbye)** key.

2. Tap the **Dial** softkey and wait for answer.

When your contact picks up, a timer recording the length of your call appears in the right upper part of your phone's screen.

Note: You can also make a speed call using a preprogrammed speed dial key. To make a speed call, tap the desired speed dial key and wait for an answer.

If you are unable to make calls within certain area codes, check with your System Administrator for any toll restrictions placed on your extension that may restrict your access to long distance area codes or dialing prefixes.

If the **Live Dialpad** option is on, as soon as you tap the first digit on the dialpad the phone automatically selects the next available line, goes off-hook, and dials as digits are tapped.


Redialing a number

You can redial the most recently dialed number by tapping the **Redial** softkey or selecting from the Call History menu.

Note: By default, the **Redial** softkey is not configured. If you want to add the Redial softkey, address to yours System Administrator.

The **Redial** function of the conference phone located in a meeting room can also be disabled by the System Administrator for privacy reasons.

To redial a number:

1. Tap the **Redial** softkey.
2. On the **Call History** menu, select one of the following tabs:
 - All
 - Missed
 - Outgoing
 - Received
3. Tap the  **(Call)** softkey next to the number you want to redial.

Receiving calls

When you have an ongoing call, you can use the phone's keys and softkeys to perform various actions, such as muting the microphone, transferring calls or creating multi-party conference calls.

When a call is ringing at your extension, the callers name, number, and avatar (if available) display on the **Call** screen.

Answering an incoming call

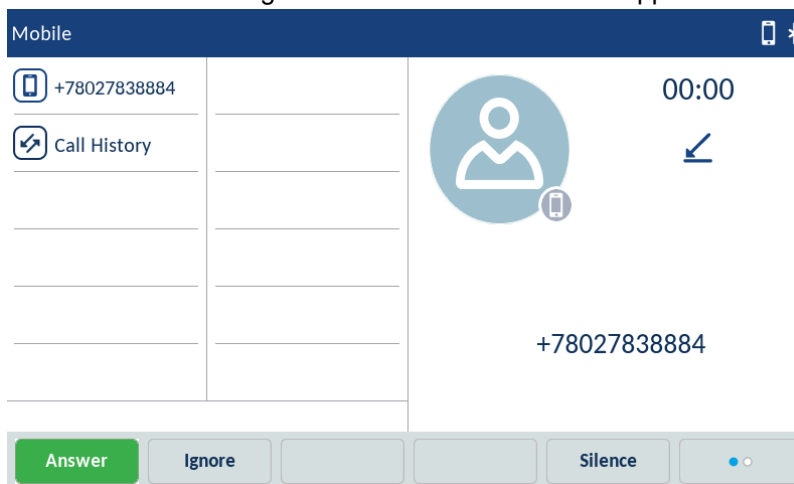
If you see on the phone screen an indication that a contact is calling you and hear a corresponding ring sound, tap the **Answer** softkey to answer the incoming call.

Answering an incoming MobileLink call

You can pair a Bluetooth mobile phone and answer the incoming calls of the paired mobile phone using the MobileLink feature. For more information, see "[MobileLink](#)" on [page 64](#).

Note: You can use this procedure only in the Logged in state.

When you receive an incoming MobileLink call, the name of the Mobile softkey changes to the number or the name of the calling contact and the Mobile label appears in the status bar.



To answer an incoming MobileLink call:

1. Tap the **Answer** softkey.
or
Tap the **Mobile** softkey.


Ignoring an incoming call

To ignore an incoming call:

1. Tap the **Ignore** softkey.
or

Press the **Goodbye** key.



Note: To immediately silence the ring tone, tap the **Silence** softkey.

If you ignore an incoming call, the  (**Missed calls**) icon with the number of missed calls appears on the **Status** bar.

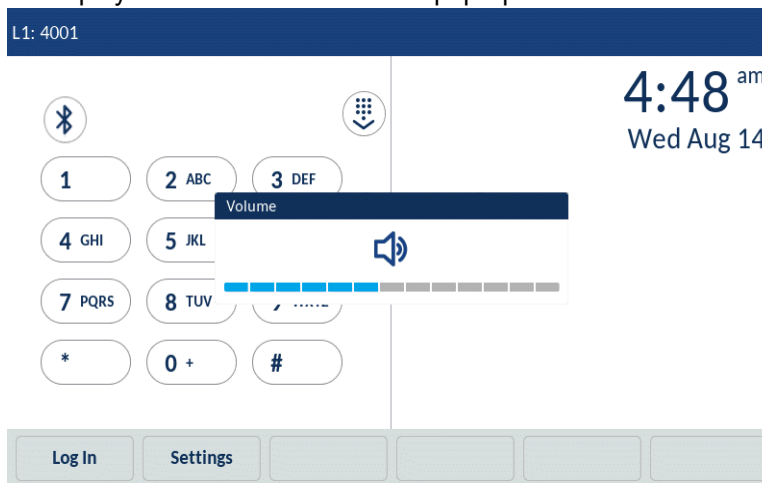
Adjusting the volume

You can use the  (**Volume down**) and the  (**Volume up**) keys to adjust the volume of the speakerphone.

To adjust the volume of the speakerphone:


1. Tap the  (**Volume up**) key to increase the volume.
2. Tap the  (**Volume down**) key to decrease the volume.

The phone displays a volume level indicator pop-up.




Note: The volume pop-up disappears after a period of time.

Muting and unmuting a call

You can use the  (**Mute**) keys to mute the call on the phone (there are two Mute buttons - one below the display and one on the top on the opposite side).

When you press the  (**Mute**) key on your phone, you cannot be heard by others on the call.

Note: The extension microphones to your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone also have **Mute** buttons on them. Pressing the **Mute** button on the extension microphone mutes the call (mutes the microphones on both the phone and the extension microphones).

The Mute indicators around the phone and the **Mute** keys illuminate red, and the **Mute** icon appears on the **Status** bar to show that the call on the phone is muted. To switch mute on or off, press the  (**Mute**) key. When the phone is unmuted, the indicators turn green again and the **Mute** icon disappears on the **Status** bar.

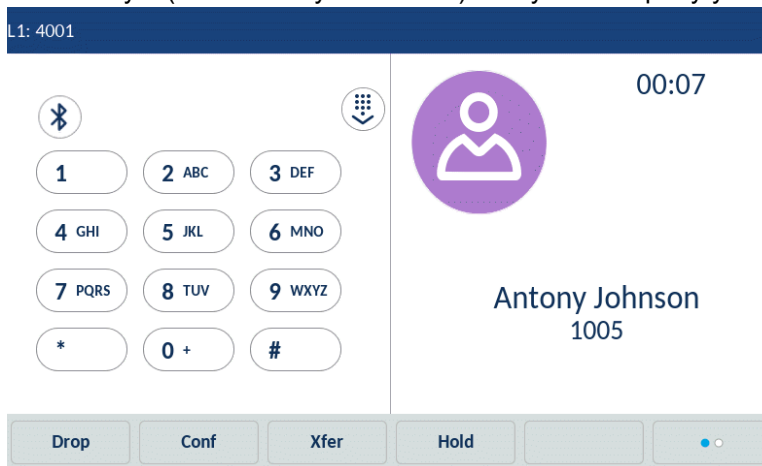
Transferring calls

There are three types of call transfer that can be performed on the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone:

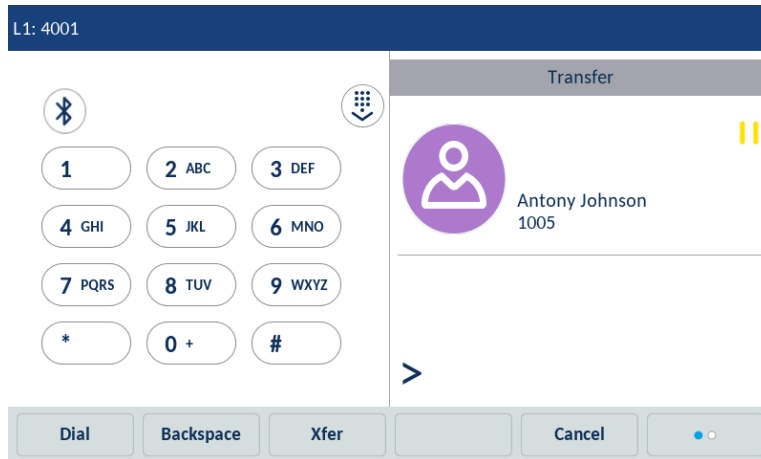
- **Blind Transfer:**
A blind transfer is when you transfer a call directly to another extension without consulting with the person receiving the call. To do this, simply complete the transfer immediately after you have entered the number. The call goes directly to the extension or external line you transferred to.
- **Consultative Transfer:**
You also have the option to consult with the person you are transferring the call to, before you complete the transfer. To do this, simply remain on the line until the receiving party answers the call. After consulting with the receiving party, you can either complete the transfer or cancel the transfer to go back to the original call.
- **Direct Transfer:**
The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone provides a convenient direct method of transferring an existing call to another existing call. If you have the transfer recipient on hold on another line, you can simply navigate to the recipient and tap the Xfer softkey and the direct transfer will be performed.

Blind and consultative transferring

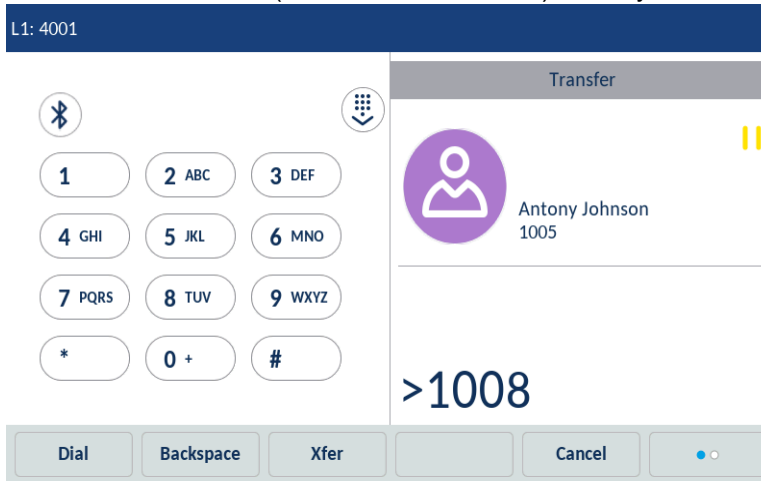
1. Connect to Party 1 (if not already connected). Party 1 is the party you want to transfer..




2. Tap the **Xfer** softkey.




3. Enter the extension number (or the outside number) to Party 2.



To cancel the transfer you can either tap the **Cancel** softkey or press the  key.

4. Complete either a blind or consultative transfer:

- To complete a blind transfer, tap the Xfer softkey key again before the receiving end answers.
- To complete a consultative transfer, tap Dial and remain on the line to speak with the Party 2, before either tapping the Xfer softkey or pressing the  key to transfer Party 1 to Party 2.

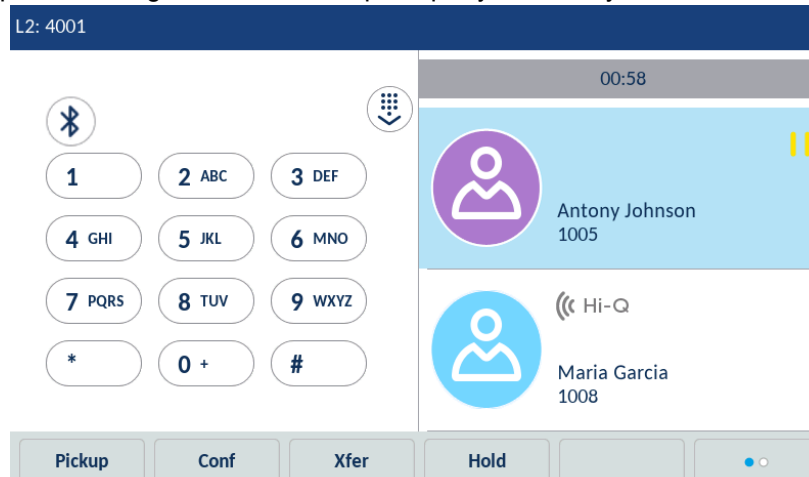
5. When the call is transferred, the phone returns to the **Home** screen.

Transferring an existing call to another existing call

1. Ensure you are on an active call with the party you wish to transfer (the transfer recipient should be placed on hold).



2. Swipe left and right to scroll and tap the party to whom you wish to transfer the active call.

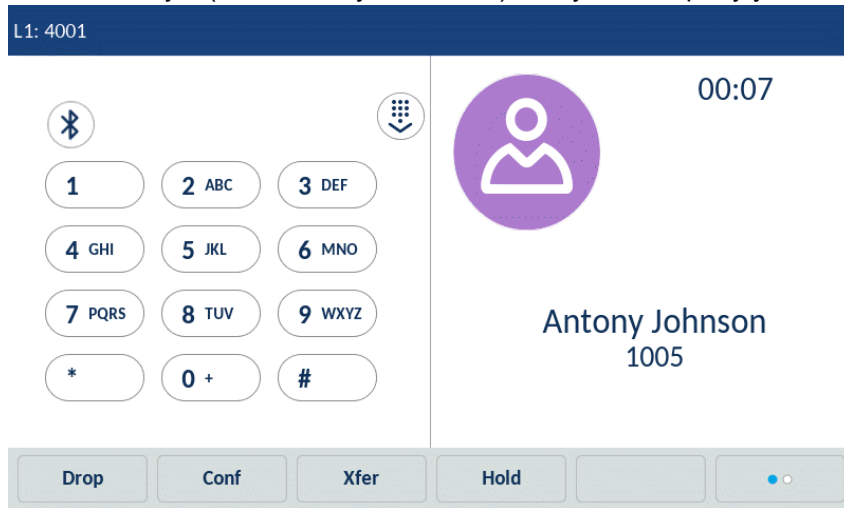


3. Tap the **Xfer** softkey. The active call will be transferred.

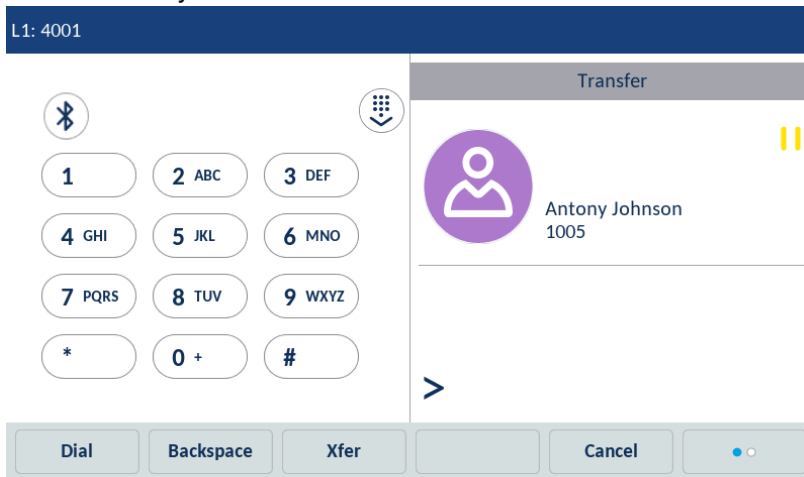
Transferring to a contact in the Directory

Users can complete a transfer to a contact in their Local Directory. If a user is in a call and initiates a transfer, they can navigate to the Directory screen and use a softkey configured with Transfer functionality to complete a blind or consultative transfer.

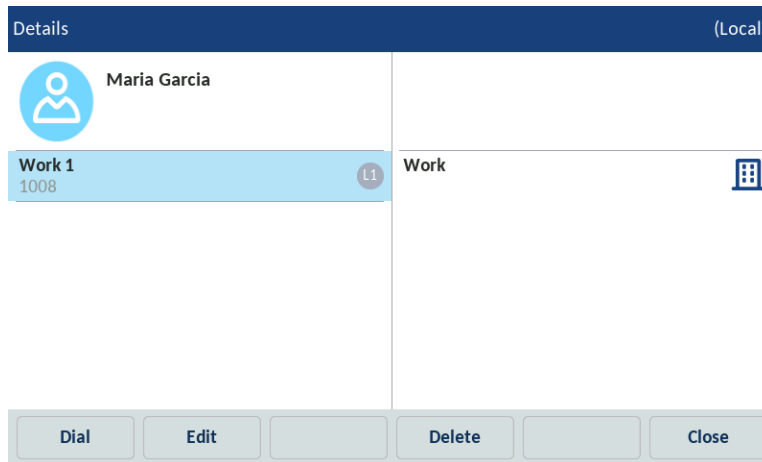
1. Connect to Party 1 (if not already connected). Party 1 is the party you want to transfer.



2. Tap the **Xfer** softkey.




3. Tap the softkey configured for **Directory** functionality and tap a directory entry and then the desired number.



Note: If you have any additional Directory sources configured, you will need to first navigate to the desired Directory folder and then highlight the respective entry or number.

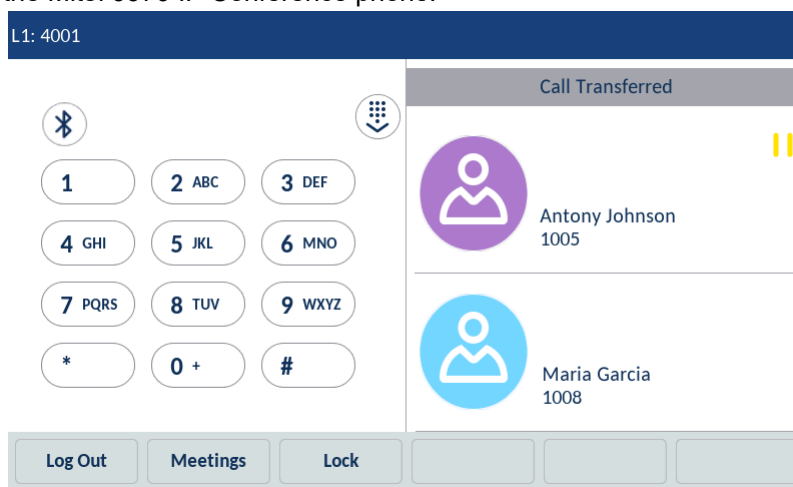
4. Complete either a blind or consultative transfer:

- To complete a blind transfer, tap **Dial** softkey to call the contact and then tap the **Xfer** softkey before the receiving end answers.
- To complete a consultative transfer, tap **Dial** softkey to call the contact. Remain on the line to speak with Party 2 before tapping the **Xfer** softkey again to transfer Party 1 to Party 2.

To cancel the transfer, tap the **Cancel** softkey or press the  (**Goodbye**) key.

Indication of Transferred Calls

When you transfer an active call, the near-end phone displays a Call Transferred screen when a call is transferred and the far-end call is dropped. The figure below illustrates the Call Transferred screen on the Mitel 6970 IP Conference phone.



Ending calls

With the call connected, tap the **Drop** softkey, or press the  (**Goodbye**) key.

Meetings

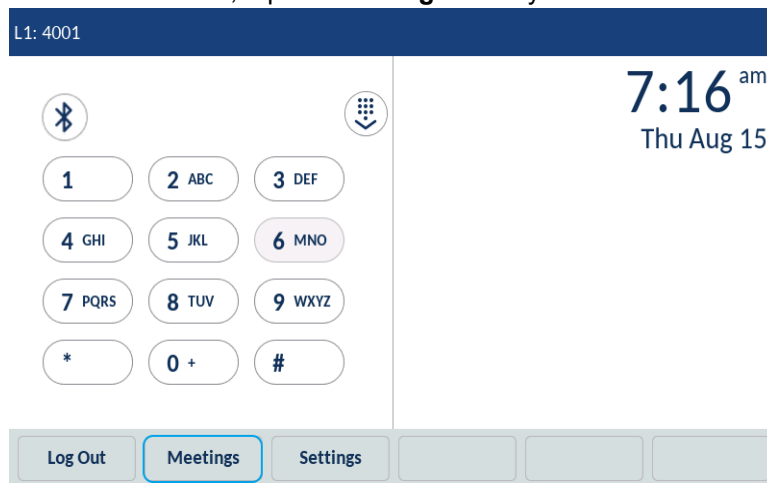
The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports the MiCollab Meeting Center application which is accessed via the Meetings softkey. Tapping the Meetings softkey provides access to the list of the day's meetings scheduled for the room the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone is located in. The Meetings Center Application allows you to one-touch join the conference bridge for the desired meeting scheduled for the user hot-desked into the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone or the room the phone is located in.

Note: Your System Administrator must configure the MiCollab Meeting Center application on the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone before it can be used.

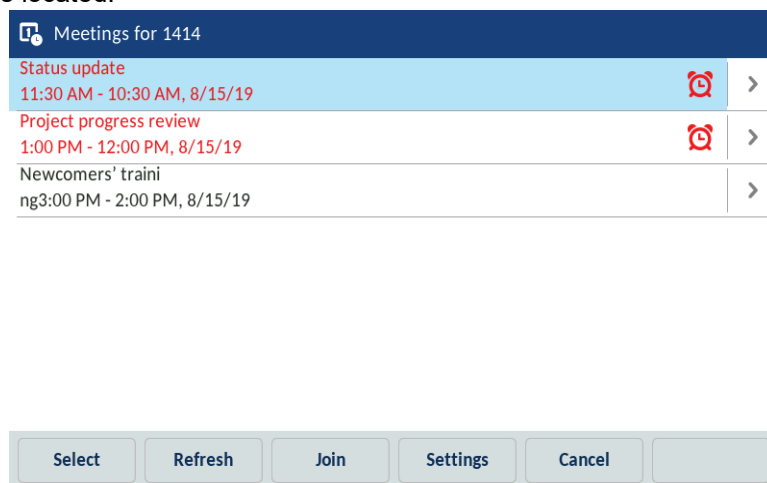
Checking the list of meetings

To check the Meetings available in the system, do the following:

1. On the idle home screen, tap the **Meetings** softkey.



The phone displays a list of meetings scheduled in the room where your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone is located.



If there are no meetings scheduled for that specific room, the phone shows the following message:

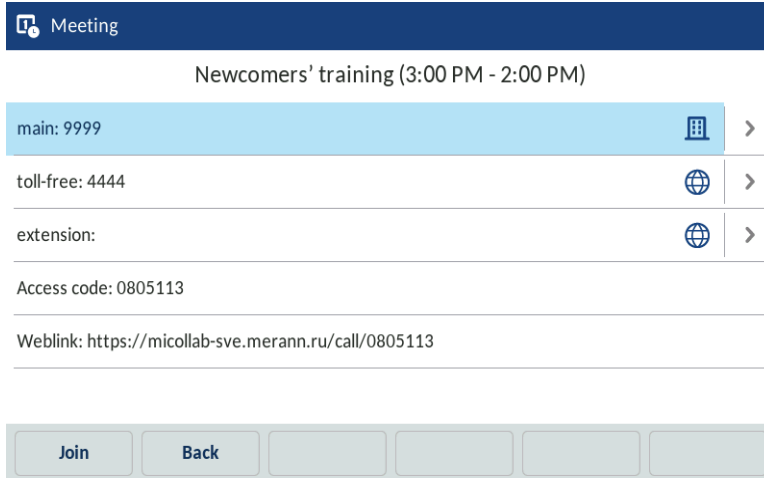

Listed are different number options for dialing into the bridge plus the access code and web share link.

5. Tap the **>** (**Arrow**) icon to dial the associated phone number.

6. Tap the **Join** softkey to join the selected meeting.

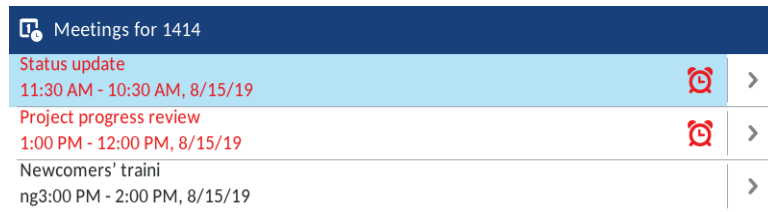

Joining the ongoing meeting

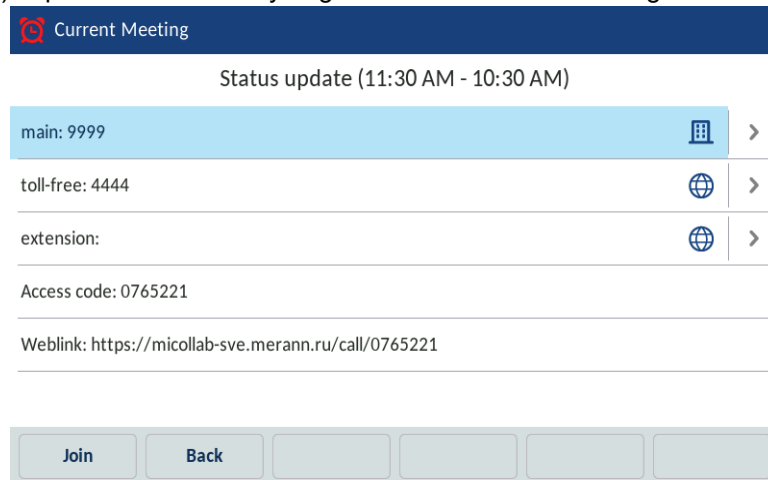
To join a meeting that is ongoing or just about to start, do the following:

1. On the idle home screen, tap the **Meetings** softkey.
2. From the list of the meetings available choose the ongoing meeting that you want to join.

Note: The currently ongoing meetings are marked with the red font and the red  (**Clock**) icon.



3. Tap a meeting from the list and then tap the Join softkey to join the selected meeting.
4. (Optional) Tap the **Select** softkey to get the details of the meeting.



Configuring meeting notifications

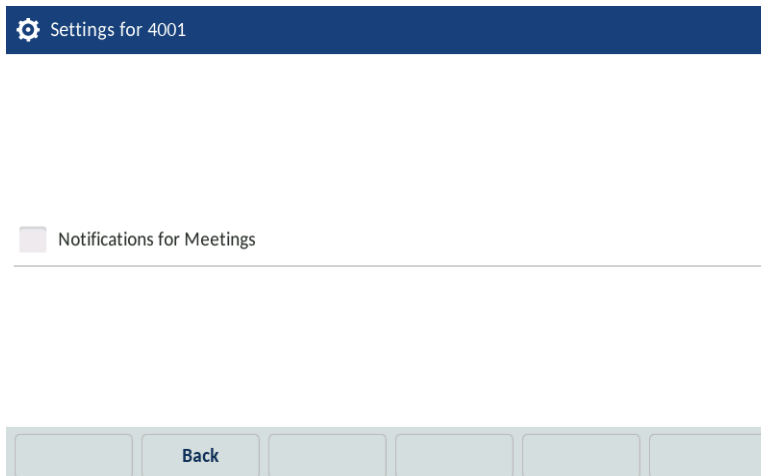
The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone can remind the user about the meetings scheduled for a specific day. The time for the notification is configured by the System Administrator for the MiCollab Meeting Center application. The user can enable and disable the notifications on the phone by adjusting the **Notifications for meetings** setting.

To adjust the **Notifications for meetings**, do the following



1. On the idle home screen, tap the **Meetings** softkey.
2. Tap the **Settings** softkey.



The phone displays the settings that the user can adjust for meetings.



Note: The list of applicable settings is configured by the System Administrator for the MiCollab Meeting Center application.

3. To disable the **Notifications for meetings** setting, tap the  (**Check mark**) icon to clear the check mark.
4. (Optional) Tap the  (**Check mark**) icon again to enable the setting.
5. Tap the **Save** softkey to save the settings.
6. (Optional) Tap the **Cancel** softkey to keep the initial settings.

Conference calls

You can use the **Conf** softkey offered on screen when in a connected call to create conference calls or use a softkey configured with Conference functionality.

Local conferencing

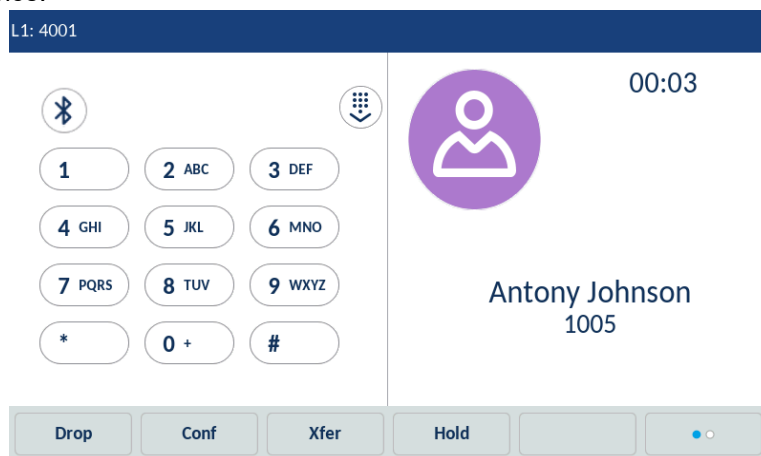
The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports up to three parties (including yourself) in a conference call. This is called local conferencing and is the default method of conferencing on the 6970.

Note: Your System Administrator can set your **Conference** key to speed dial a specific number. Contact your System Administrator for more information.

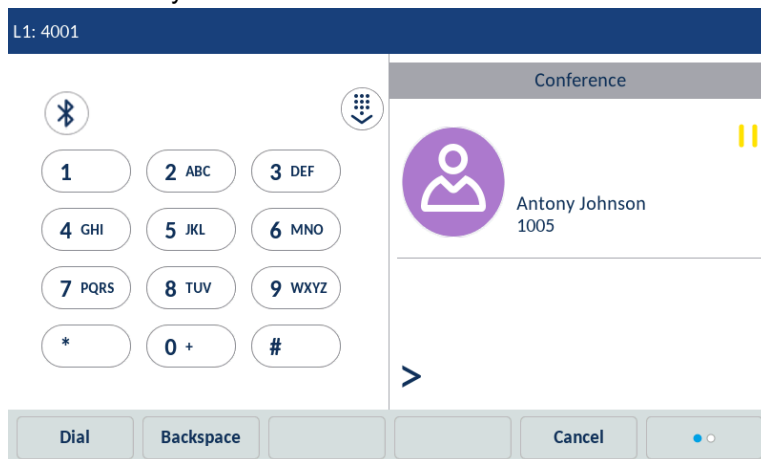
Creating a conference call using Local conferencing

Use the following procedure to create a conference call using local conferencing.

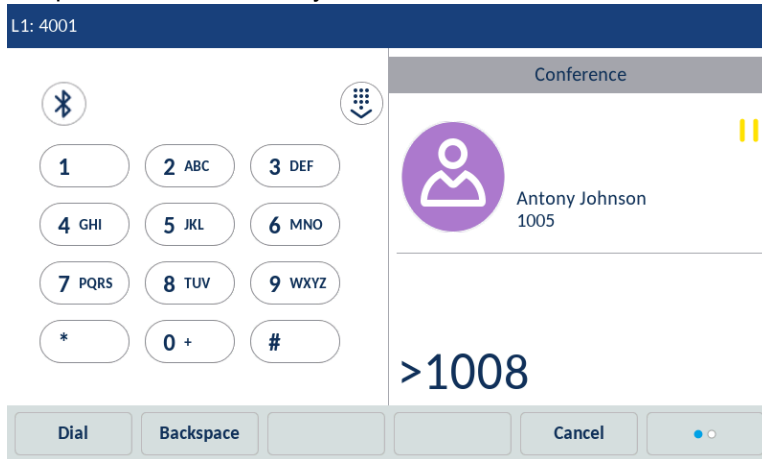
1. Ensure you are on an active call with one of the parties with whom you wish to create a conference.



2. Tap the **Conf** softkey.



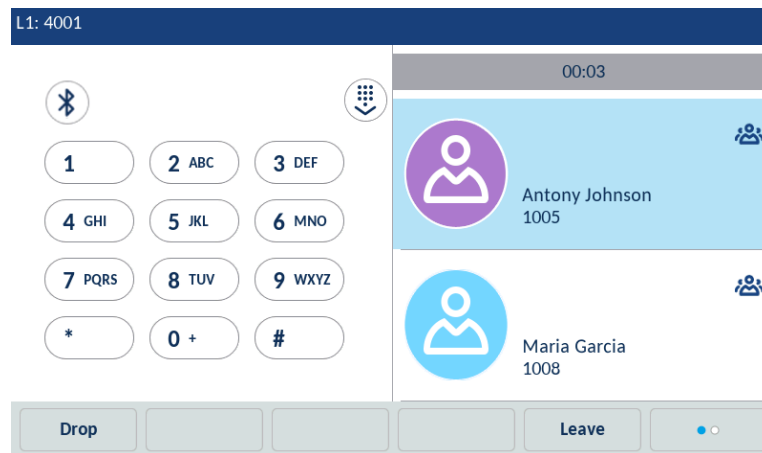
3. Enter the phone number of Party 3.



4. Wait for Party 3 to answer. When Party 3 answers, you can consult with them before adding them to the conference.



5. Tap the **Conf** softkey again to add Party 3 to the conference. Party 2 and Party 3 will connect with you to form a conference call.



6. To drop a party from the conference, swipe up and down to scroll, tap the desired party, and tap the **Drop** softkey.

Creating a conference call by joining two existing calls

1. Ensure you are on an active call with one of the parties with whom you wish to create a conference (the other party should be placed on hold).

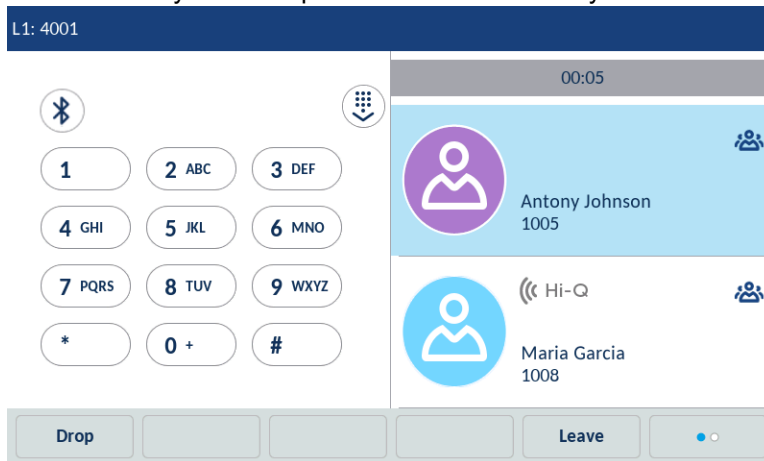


Note: Direct conferencing can be performed in either the **Multi-View Call** screen or **Detailed View Call** screen.

2. Swipe left or right to scroll and tap the party you wish to conference in.



3. Tap the **Conf** softkey. The two parties will connect with you to form a conference call.



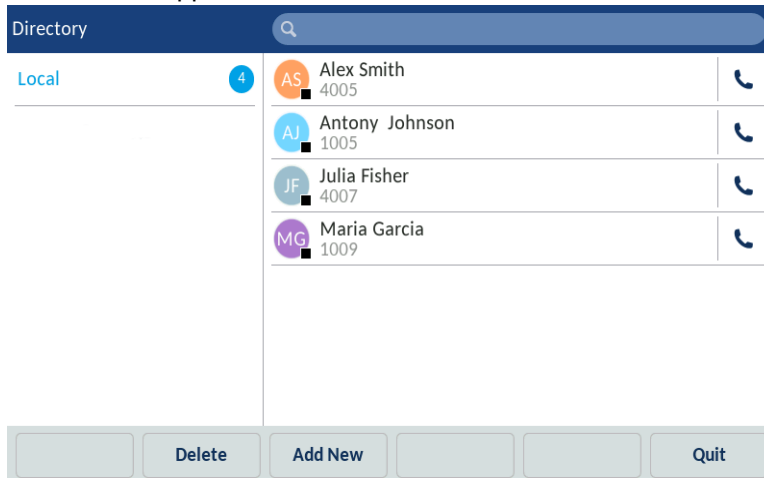
Ending a conference and transferring remaining parties

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone allows a host to easily leave a three-way conference call without disrupting the connection of the other two remaining parties.

If you are the host of a conference call and want to leave the conference, tap the **Leave** softkey on the phone. Your phone leaves the three-way conference call but the remaining parties are still connected together.

Directory

The **Directory** application provides access to your directory. Directory can contain different contact folders. By default, there is only Local contact folder available. The other contact folders, such as Mobile, Corporate or other, must be configured by your System Administrator. The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone also supports a localized **Personal** contact folder.




Note: Access to Corporate directories must be set up by your System Administrator.

For more information about the Directory features, see *Mitel 6940 SIP Phone User Guide*.

General functions

Accessing and navigating the **Directory** application

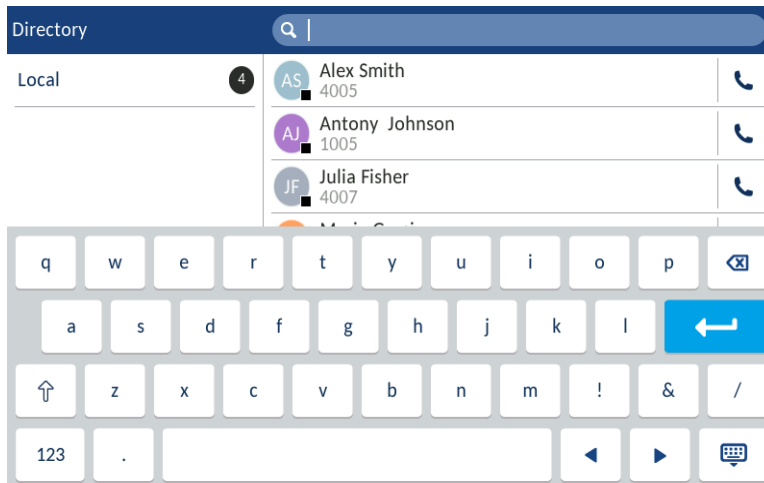
To access and navigate the **Directory** application:

1. Tap the  (**Directory**) key.
2. Tap the contact folder you wish to view.

Note: If the folder you selected is empty, a "Directory empty" message displays on the screen.

3. In the contacts folder, search the contact that you want to call.
You can do it as follows:

Enter the name of the contact in the search bar. The keyboard automatically pops up when you tap the search bar.

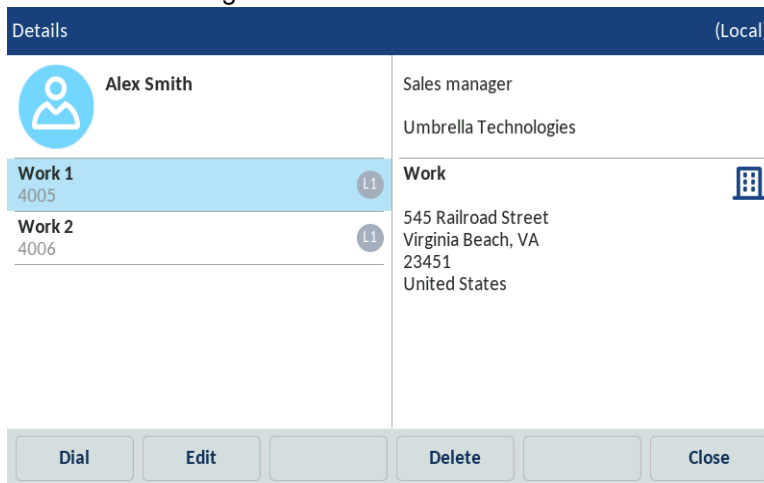


or

Swipe up and down to scroll through the list of contacts.

4. To dial the selected contact, tap the dial icon beside the contact's name.

5. Tap the contact name to access the contact card for that contact. This allows you to see additional numbers that might be available for that contact.



6. Tap the **Dial** softkey.

7. (Optional) Tap the **Close** softkey to exit.

Performing a search

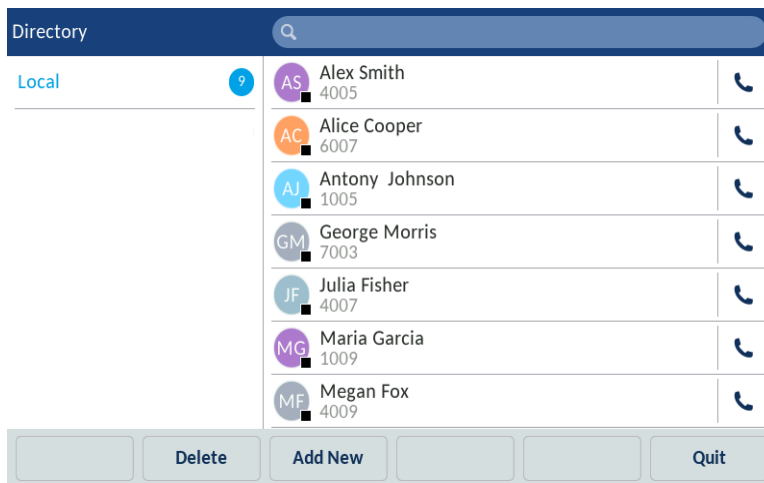
Search functionality is applied across all the available and enabled directories. Tapping any dialpad key or tapping the search bar initiates the search. After entering the first few letters of the contacts first name, last name, or company name, you can then quickly select a contact and perform the desired action. If external Directory sources are configured and enabled, you can select a contact

from the consolidated “All” folder to perform an action, or navigate to the contact in the specific Directory folder to perform the desired action.

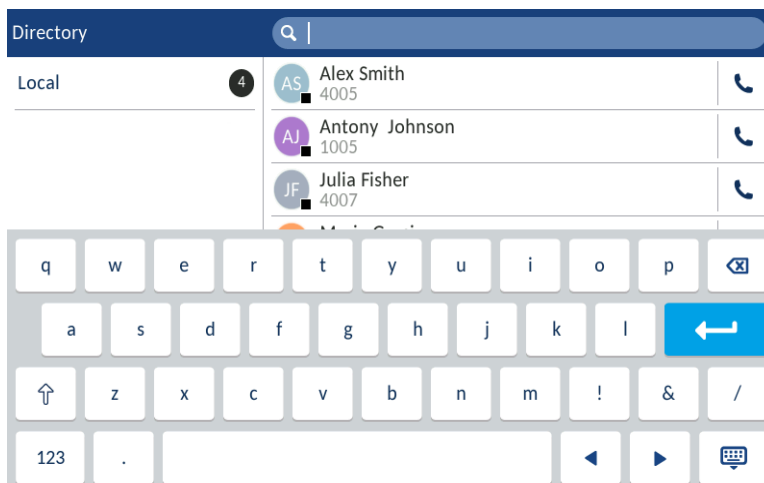
Note: Depending on how your Administrator has configured the search functionality, you may need to tap a Search softkey in order to execute the search function.

To perform a search:

1. Tap the  (Directory) key.



2. Tap the search bar.
The phone displays the on-screen keyboard.





Note: Hide the keyboard by tapping the  (Keyboard) icon or clear the search field by tapping the  (Delete) icon.

3. Enter the first letters of the contact's name using the on-screen keyboard.
4. As you type, the phone returns matches for the characters that have been entered. Typing more characters narrows the search providing a closer set of matches to the desired name you are searching for.

5. (Optional) Scroll through the list of contacts.
6. When matches are found, tap the dial icon beside the desired contact entry.
7. Tap the **Close** softkey to exit.

Dialing from the Contact Card

To dial a contact's phone number.

1. Press the  (**Directory**) key.
2. (Optional) Tap the search bar, enter the first letters of the contact's name to initiate the search function.
3. Tap the contact you want to call to open his/her contact card.
4. (Optional) If the contact has multiple phone numbers defined, tap the desired number on screen (if no external Directory sources are configured/enabled).
4. Tap the  (**Call**) icon beside the number you wish to dial.

Local Directory features

The internal Local Directory contains the contacts that have been created or copied directly to the phone using the phone UI. If no external directory sources are available, pressing the Directory key will open the Local Directory menu.

From the Local Directory menu, you can search for a contact, place a call to the selected contact, add new contacts to the Local Directory, delete all contacts, delete individual contacts, or edit existing contacts. Users can also view contact details (e.g. title, company name, numbers, work and home addresses, e-mail addresses, etc...).

You can also assign an individual contact ring tone to contacts in your Local Directory. Individual contact ring tones can be used during incoming calls to help you identify the party calling. You can select contact-specific ring tones (from the phone's 15 preloaded as well as the 8 custom ring tones) for respective contacts in your Local Directory, which will be played back when a call from the respective contact is incoming.

Individual contact ring tone support is dependent on the phone's directory lookup functionality. During an incoming call, the Local Directory is examined against the phone number of the incoming call. If a match is found and the contact has an associated contact ring tone, the contact ring tone is played.

If a match is not found or if a contact ring tone is not assigned, the standard ring tone for the line being used to field the incoming call is played.

Note:

1. In instances where a custom ring tone is selected as the individual contact ring tone for a Local Directory contact and subsequently the custom ring tone is deleted, the standard ring tone will be played.
2. Individual contact ring tone support is applicable to the Local Directory only. If you would like to apply a ring tone for a contact in an external directory source (e.g. CSV-based directories, Exchange Contacts, and LDAP directories) or Incoming Callers List/Outgoing Redial List, you must first copy the desired contact to the Local Directory.


Using the IP phone UI you can perform the following actions with regards to the Local Directory:

- Add new contacts to the Local Directory
- Edit entries in the Local Directory
- Delete all entries from the Local Directory
- Delete individual entries from the Local Directory

Note: Up to 1000 Directory contacts can be stored locally on the phone.

Adding a new contact to the Local Directory

To add a new contact to the Local Directory:

1. Press the  (**Directory**) key.
2. If no external sources are configured, tap the **Add New** softkey.
or
If external Directory sources are configured/enabled and if the Local Directory contains contacts, press an entry in the list and tap the **Add New** softkey.
3. In the **Identity** tab, tap the desired field and enter the first name, last name, job title and organization of the contact using the on-screen keyboard.

4. (Optional) Select the **Ring Tone** field and tap the left and right arrow softkeys to select the desired ring tone for the respective contact.

5. In the **Numbers** tab, select the respective field and enter the desired number of the local contact using the on-screen keyboard.
6. (Optional) You can also enter Work Address, Home Address and Email information by selecting the respective tabs.
7. Tap the **Save** softkey to save the contact to the Local Directory.

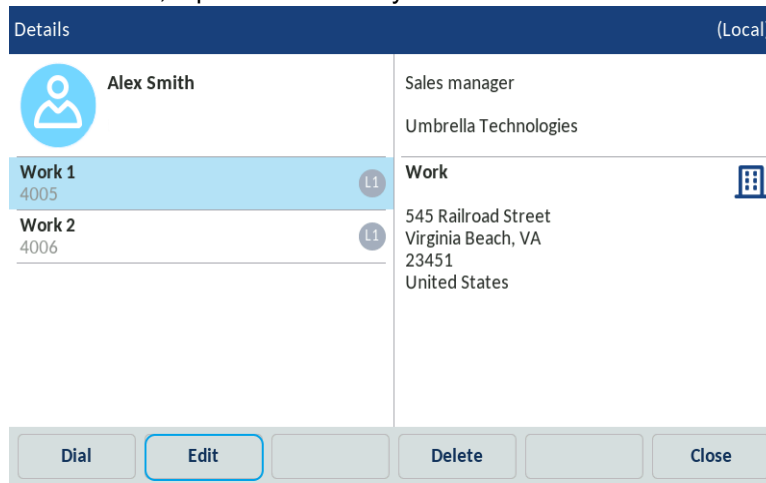

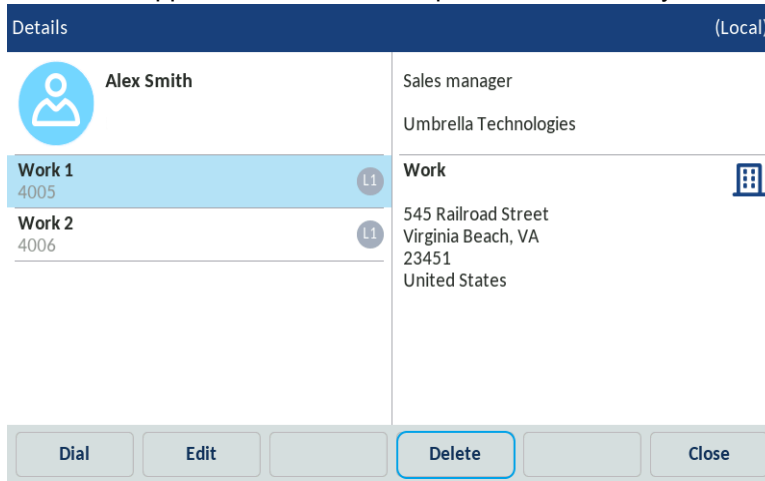

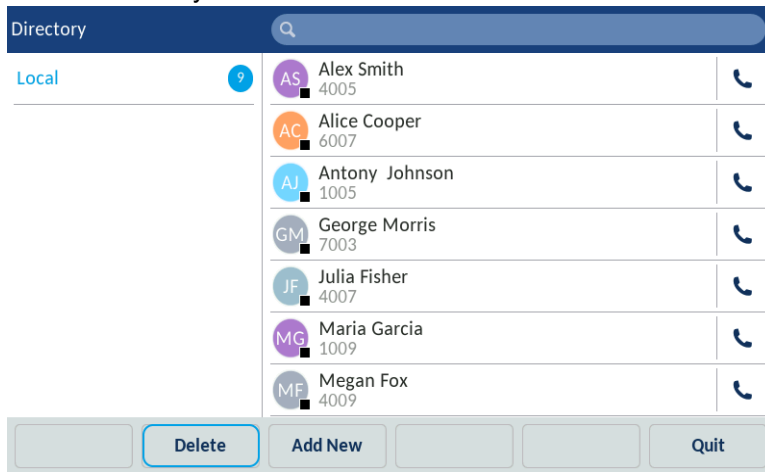

Note: Tap the **Cancel** softkey to cancel the deletion process.

2. In the Directory field, click **Save As...**

Configuring softkeys

Your Mitel 6970 IP phone has 12 multi-function top softkeys and 6 multi-function bottom softkeys:

- 12 top softkeys: programmable non-state-based softkeys (up to 48 programmable functions)
- 6 bottom softkeys: programmable state-based softkeys (up to 30 programmable functions)

You can program or edit the Speed Dial function on the top or bottom softkeys by tapping and holding the respective softkey for the configured duration.

For more information on how to configure the other softkeys through the Mitel Web UI, see the *Mitel 6940 SIP Phone User Guide* or contact your System Administrator.

Configuring Speed Dial softkeys

The **Speed Dial** softkey allows you to dial a specified number with one tap of the key. **Speed Dial** softkeys can be useful as they can be programmed to dial external numbers, dial directly to another person's extension or quickly access features that use feature access codes. You can also transfer calls to or create conference calls using your Speed Dial softkeys in place of dialing out manually.

Press-and-hold to create a Speed Dial

To program or edit a **Speed Dial** softkey:

1. Press and hold the applicable top or bottom softkey for the configured duration.

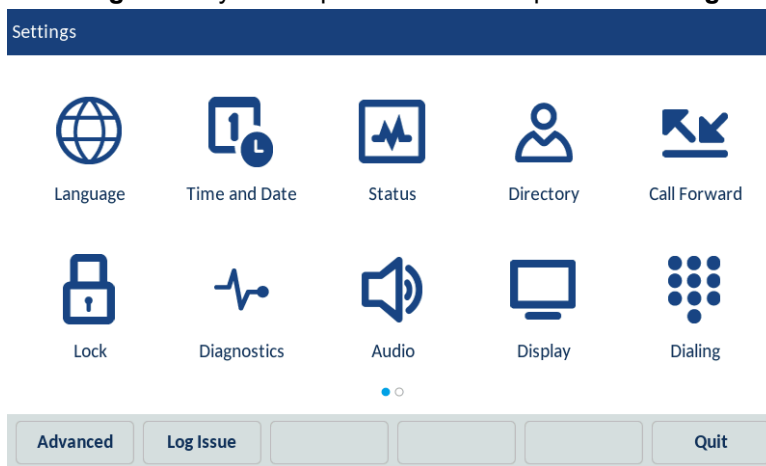

1. The **Settings** menu is different in the Login and Logout modes.

Bluetooth

MobileLink

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports MobileLink, a feature that provides seamless mobile integration using Bluetooth wireless technology. A user can pair and connect a mobile phone with the 6970 IP Conference Phone while not in the Hot desk logged in state. Paired devices will auto-connect while the user is not Hot desk logged in also.

A button that provides access to the Bluetooth Settings is available on the dial pad screen.



MobileLink highlights include the ability to:

- Sync your mobile phone’s contact list with your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone.
- Answer a mobile phone call using your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone.
- Move mobile call audio between the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone and your mobile phone.

Note: The MobileLink feature is supported only on iOS and Android mobile phones.

The MobileLink feature requires a specific Mobile softkey (initially labelled "Connect") to be added to the phone. For more information, see [“Configuring the Mobile softkey through the Mitel Web UI”](#) on page 65.

To support MobileLink, the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone uses Bluetooth wireless technology. The embedded Bluetooth 4.1 enables support of the MobileLink capability.

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports Bluetooth connections to Bluetooth mobile phones.

Using the **Bluetooth** settings menu on the phone UI, you can enable and disable the Bluetooth functionality on your phone as required.

Update Delete

Automatic update of your mobile phone call history is not supported. For example, if a user receives a call on the mobile phone, the call record is not automatically updated in the **Call History** application. The call record is updated the next time when the mobile phone connects to the 6970 IP phone or by a manual update.

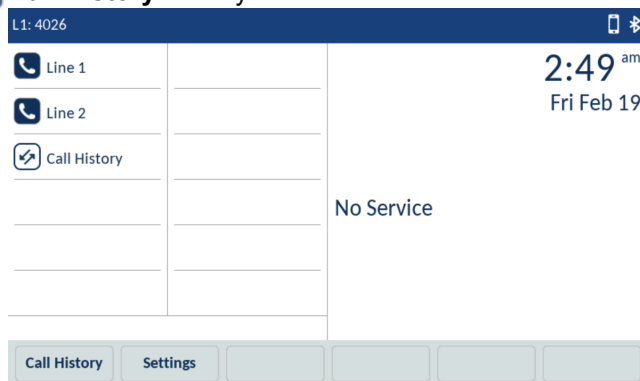

2. If the update fails, a failed to retrieve contacts message displays on screen. Tap **Retry** to attempt to update again, or **Cancel** to cancel the attempt.

4. If you pair a second mobile phone with your 6970 IP phone, the 6970 IP phone automatically syncs the mobile **call history** of the second mobile phone to the Call History application. To re-sync the mobile call history of your first (or an already paired) mobile phone to the **Call History** application, connect the mobile phone to your 6970 IP phone.
5. The **Call History** application stores and displays the mobile phone call history even when the paired mobile phone is not connected to your 6970 IP phone.

This category allows you to change the user password for your phone. Changing your password ensures that only you can alter your phone settings and helps keep your system secure. You can change your user password using the IP phone UI or the Mitel Web UI.

CONFIGURING A USER PASSWORD

If unsupported characters are present in the user password or if the password length exceeds 15 characters in the configuration file then the phone uses the default password. The default password for user is blank.



The following full character sets are supported:

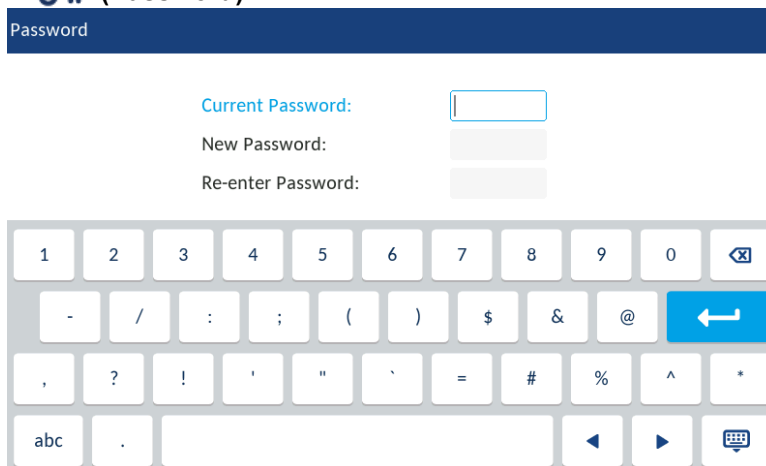

4. In the **Current Password:** field, enter the current user password.
5. In the **New Password:** field, enter the new user password.
6. In the **Re-enter Password:** field, re-enter the new user password.
7. Tap the **Save** softkey to save your changes.

A **Password Changed** confirmation message displays on the screen.

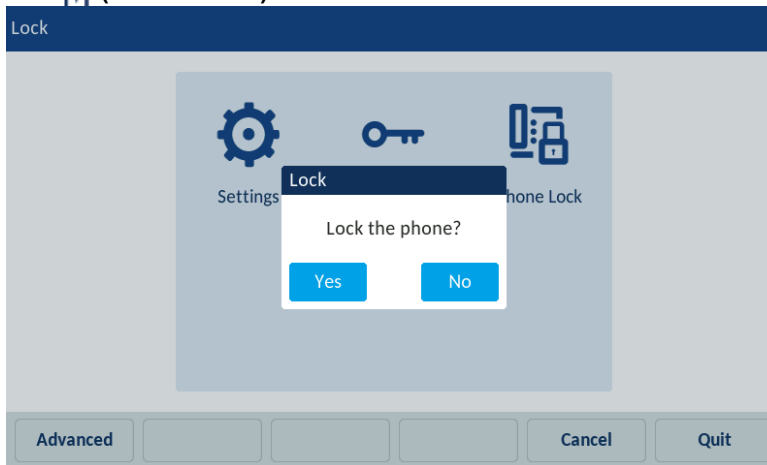
Phone Lock

You can lock your phone to prevent the phone from being used or configured. You can lock the phone using the IP phone UI, Mitel Web UI or by configuring a Lock softkey on your phone.

Locking the phone using the IP Phone UI

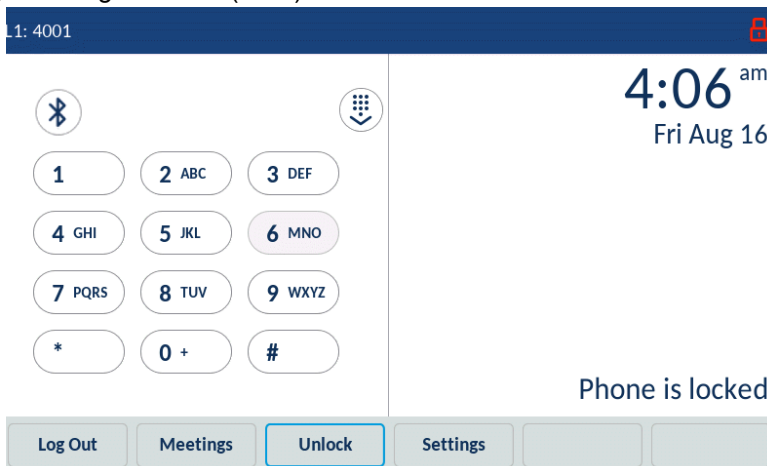

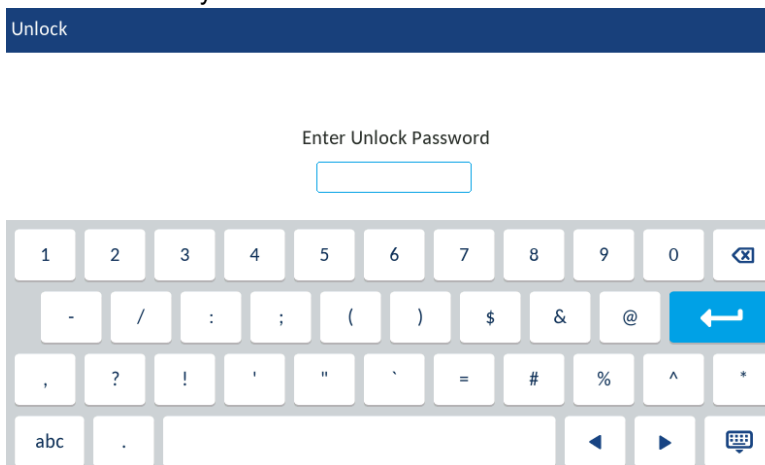

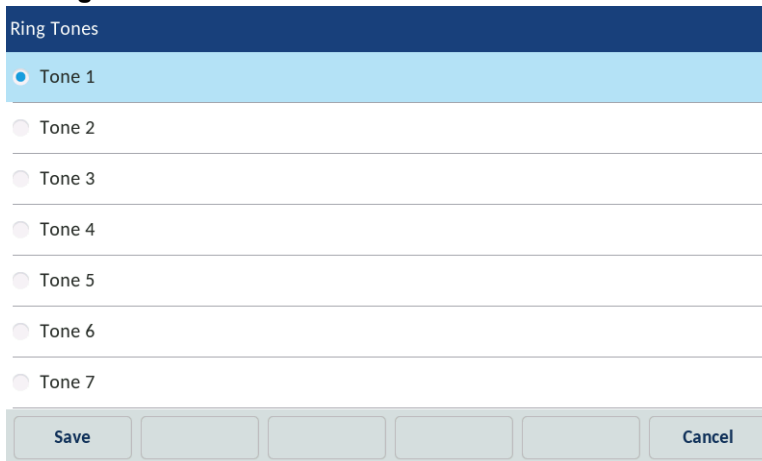

Display

The display setting allows you to set the following on your phone:

- **Home screen:**

The **Screen mode** option allows you to select how your Home screen is displayed. There are two options available.

The **Screen Saver Timer** setting allows you to configure the amount of time (up to 7200 seconds) the phone must be idle before the screen saver starts. The default is 1800 seconds (30 minutes). When the specified amount of time expires, a screen saver displaying the date and time and the number of missed calls (if applicable) is displayed on the screen.



- **Brightness:**

The **Brightness Level** setting allows you to set the amount of light that illuminates the LCD display. There are 5 levels available.

The **Brightness Timer** option allows you to set the amount of time you want the LCD display to stay illuminated before turning the backlight off during a period of inactivity. You can set the timer from 1 to 36000 seconds. Default is 600 (10 minutes).

- **Push Notifications:**

The **Sound** checkbox allows you to turn on and off the sound of the push notifications.

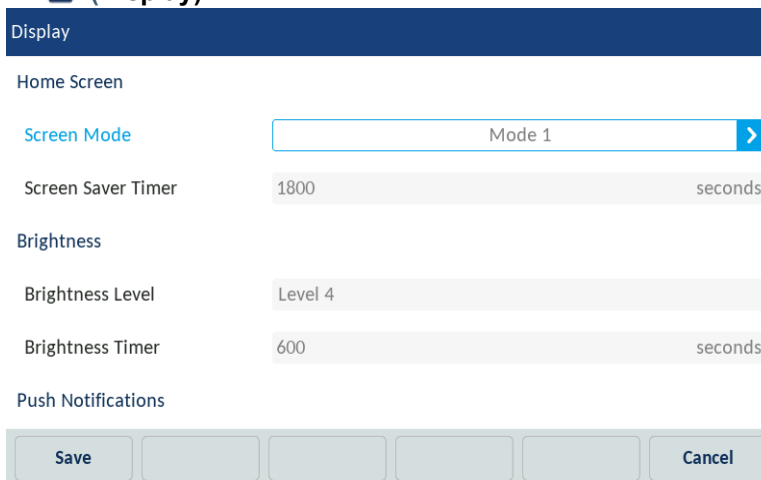
The **Bluetooth** checkbox allows you to turn on and off the push notification when the bluetooth device is paired or unpaired.

The **External** checkbox allows you to turn on and off the push notifications for external events.

To configure the display settings:

1. Tap the **Settings** softkey on the phone screen to open the **Settings** menu.

2. Tap the  (**Display**) icon.



3. In the **Screen mode** field, select the screen mode by tapping the left and right arrows.
4. In the **Screen Saver Timer** field, enter a value, in seconds, using the on-screen keyboard.
5. In the **Brightness Level** field, select the intensity of brightness by tapping the left and right arrows.
6. In the **Brightness Timer** field, enter a value, in seconds, using the on-screen keyboard.
7. Check the **Sound** checkbox, to enable sound for the push notifications.
8. Check the **Bluetooth** checkbox to enable push notifications when pairing or unpairing a bluetooth device.
9. Check the **External** checkbox, to enable pushnotifications for external events.
10. Tap the **Save** softkey to save the changes.
To drop the changes, tap the **Cancel** softkey.

Dialing

The Dialing option is available in the Logged in state only.

Live Dialpad

The **Live Dialpad** option on the IP phone turns the live dialpad mode on or off. With the live dialpad feature enabled, the number is dialed automatically after being entered and it is not required to tap the Dial softkey.

Note: Availability of this feature is dependent on your phone system or service provider.

1. Tap the **Settings** softkey on the phone screen to open the **Settings** menu.

2. Tap the  (**Dialing**) icon.

Note: If required, swipe right to switch pages in the Settings menu.

3. Tap the  (**Live Dialing**) icon.



4. Tap **On** or **Off** to enable or disable the live dialpad feature.

5. Tap the **Save** softkey to save your changes.

Speed Dial edit

Note: For details on speed dial configuration, see “Configuring Speed Dial softkeys” on page 48.

4. Tap the **Save** softkey to save your changes.

Restart

You should only restart your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone if directed to do so by your system administrator.

Hotdesk Users

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports the MiVoice Business Hotdesk feature. The feature must be first configured by the System Administrator.

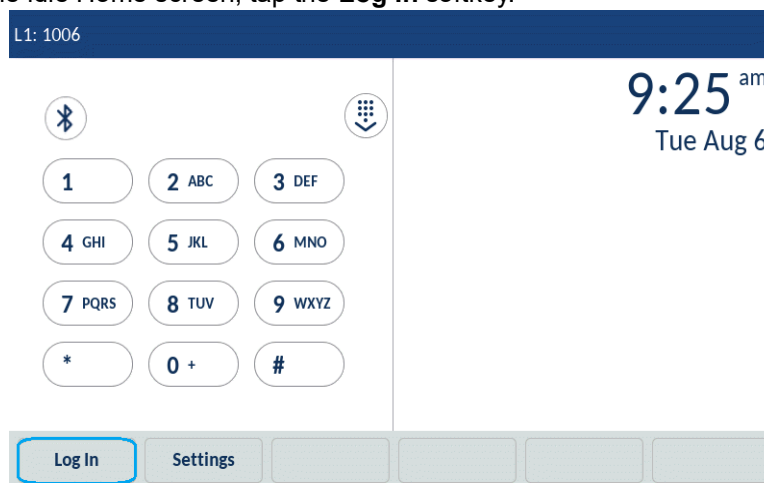
If the feature is configured and you are a Hotdesk user, you can log in into the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone, and it will assume your profile and configured settings. Please refer to the User guide for your 6900 desk phone for more information on the Hotdesk feature.

The following describes the differences that you will observe between the Hotdesk feature on the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone and your 6900 desk phone.

Logging into your Hot Desk profile

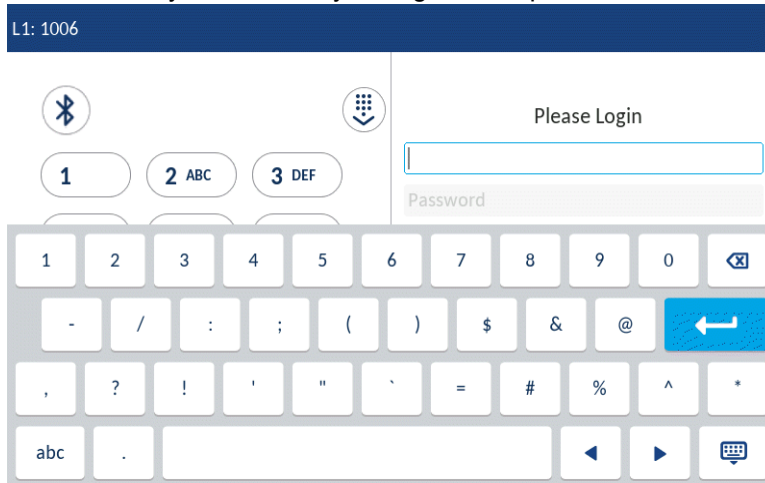
To log in, do the following:

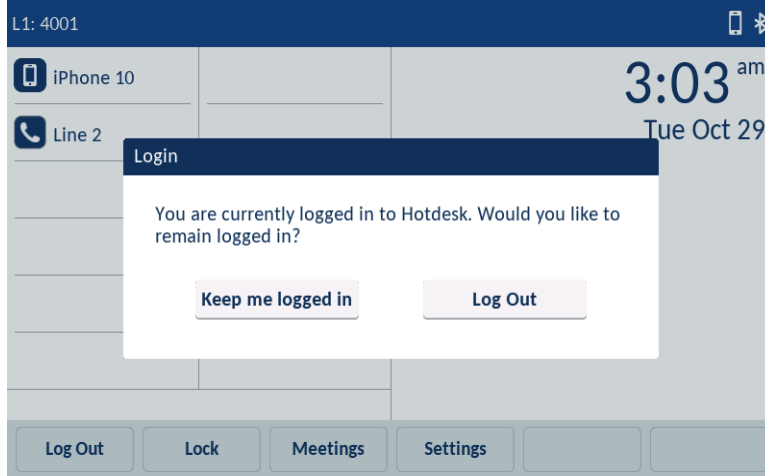
Logging out of the Hot Desk

To log out of the Hot Desk, do the following:

1. On the Home screen, tap the  (**Log Out**) softkey, and then tap Log Out again on the subsequent screen or Login if you did not intend to log out.

Auto logout on Call Termination

When you are logged in, the phone displays a pop-up message after the end of every call.



Tap the **Keep me logged in** softkey to stay logged in. The pop-up message disappears.

or

Tap the **Log Out** softkey to move from the Logged In to the Logged Out state. No further confirmation is required.

If you neglect to press either option, the phone will automatically log you out when the pop-up disappears. This is to ensure the privacy of your information in the event you forget to logout while using a Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone in a meeting room.

Note: This feature can be disabled by your System Administrator.

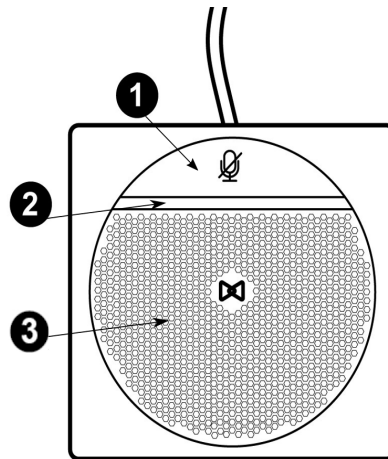

Accessory support

Corded Extension Microphones

To ensure better coverage of the larger premises, the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports up to 2 extension microphones. Use of the extension microphone will extend the pick up range of the phone to allow it to be used in large boardrooms.

Each extension microphone has a Mute button **1**, an LED indicator **2**, and the microphone **3**.



LED indicators

The extension microphone LEDs are intended to indicate the state of the call. The indicators are bi-color: green or red. Green shows an active call and red indicates that the active call is muted.

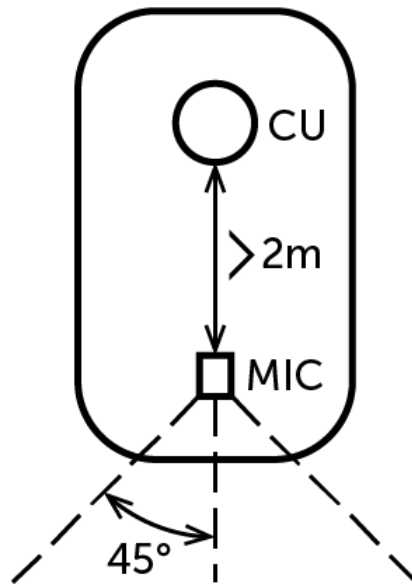
Possible combinations with the phone

The Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone supports the connection of two external microphones via two connectors in the base of the unit. You can choose to add one or two extension microphones to the phone, however, the microphones are sold in pairs.

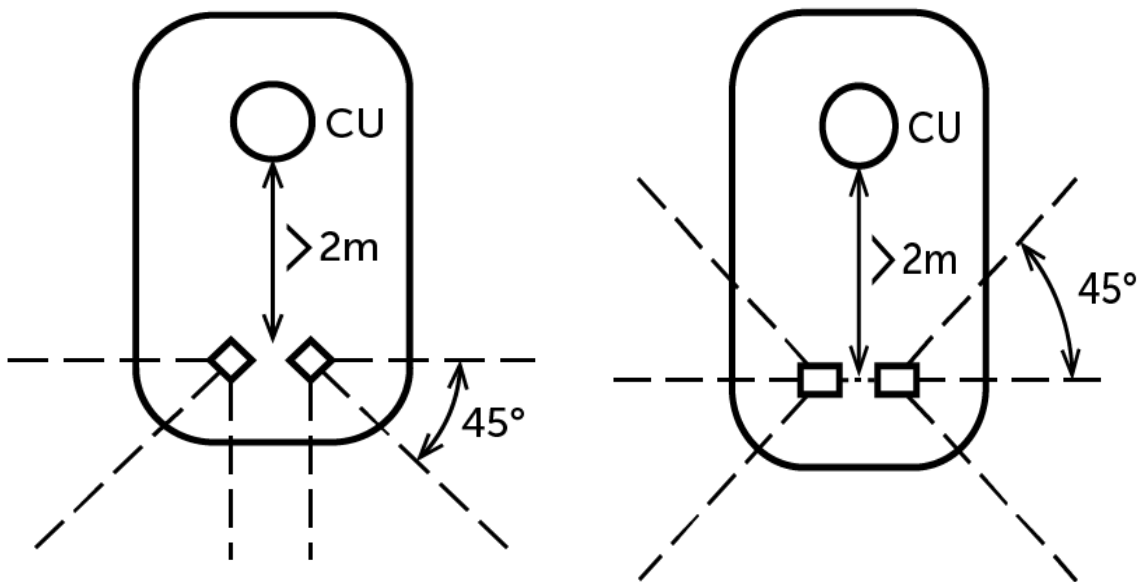
Below are possible placements of the extension microphones showing the angle of the sound coverage for each of the arrangements.

Note: The extension microphone(s) must be placed at least 6.5 ft (2 m) from the main unit for proper operation.

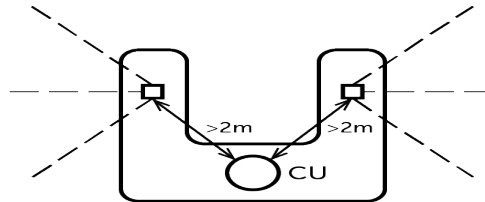
A. Conference table with the conference phone unit (CU) and one extension microphone attached

The length of the extension microphone cable is up to 8 ft (2.5 m).

Connection of extension microphones

To connect an extension microphone:

1. On the back of the phone, locate the micro-USB input port.
2. Carefully insert the extension microphone cable into the micro-USB input port.

CAUTION: Plugging any other than a Mitel extension microphone into the port may cause damage to the conference phone.


Use of corded extension microphones


To use the corded extension microphones with your Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone:

1. Connect the extension microphones as described above.
2. Locate them on the conference table so that to boost the sound pick up for all the participants of the conference call.

Note: Place the microphones flat on the table to boost the pick up in the conference room.

3. Answer / make a call.

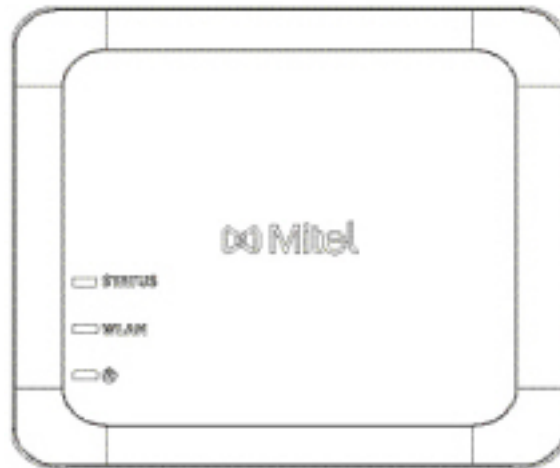
4. (Optional) Mute and unmute the extension microphone during a call by pressing the **(Mute)** button on the microphone. 

Note: Muting an individual extension microphone only mutes that microphone. Audio is still enabled for the conference through the Mitel 6970 IP Conference Phone. To mute the entire conference you must tap the  key on the phone.

Mitel Wireless LAN Adapter

The Mitel WLAN Adapter is a wireless bridge that can add wireless connectivity functionality to your Mitel 6970 IP phone. It allows your Ethernet-enabled phone to join a secure, high-speed network. It is software-transparent, that is, no changes to drivers, management tools, or applications are needed to use this adapter.

The Mitel Wireless LAN Adapter is a high-performance wireless network adapter that enables any Ethernet device to function as an 802.11a/b/g/n dual-band wireless network device, giving you the freedom to place it anywhere in your facility.

The Mitel Wireless LAN Adapter is designed to communicate in the 2.4-GHz and 5-GHz bands. Radio interference in the commonly used 2.4-GHz band can be avoided by utilizing the 5-GHz band.

Installing and Configuring a WLAN Adapter

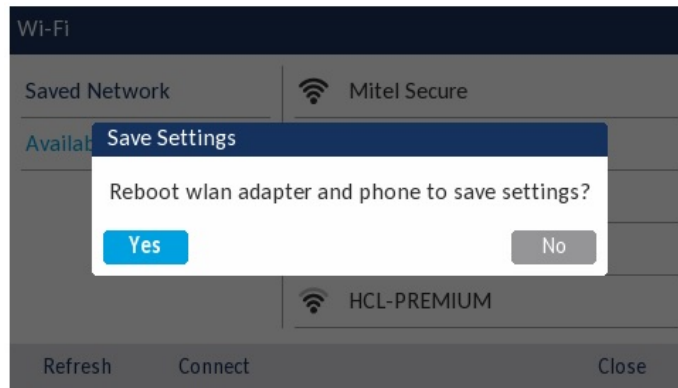
1. Factory Reset the WLAN adapter by doing the following:
 1. Disconnect the AC plug of the Mitel WLAN adapter from the electrical outlet.
 2. Reconnect the AC plug to the outlet and push down the switch to power on the Mitel WLAN Adapter. The green LED for wired LAN connector illuminates. After 2 seconds, when the LED changes to red, release the switch to delete all configured data. The device is set to factory default.
2. Plug the WLAN Adapter into the Mitel 6970 IP phone using the network cable provided. Plug one end of the cable into the network jack on the adapter (POE port) and the other end into the network jack on the back of the phone.
3. On the DHCP screen, press Skip. The DHCP discovery interludes at approximately 30 seconds and the Wi-Fi settings menu is displayed on the phone.
4. The phone displays the idle screen and then the **Voice Service** menu. Press the **Options** key. Scroll horizontally to the WiFi menu and press **Select**.
5. The **Available Networks** settings menu will be displayed after approximately 30 seconds.



6. Select an SSID (that is, the name of a Wi-Fi network; for example, Mitel Secure) from **Available Networks** to connect. If the SSID is secured, a password prompt appears.
7. Enter the password for the network and select **Save**. The Save Settings window appears.



8. Select **Yes** to save your settings and to reboot the WLAN adapter and the phone. The phone is successfully connected to the network.



9. The connected SSID (Mitel Secure) is listed under **Saved Network**.

Troubleshooting Solutions

Why is my display blank?

Ensure that power is being provided to your phone. If your network does not provide inline power over Ethernet, you can obtain an additional accessory, the Mitel PoE (Power over Ethernet) inline power supply, to provide power over Ethernet locally to your phone. See the **Connecting to the Network and to Power** section in the *Mitel 6970 Installation Guide* for details.

Why can't I get a dial tone?

Check for any loose connections and that the phone has been installed properly. For installation instructions, please refer to the **Installation and Setup** section in the *Mitel 6970 Installation Guide*.

Why doesn't my phone ring?

Check the ring volume on your phone. It may be turned down or turned off. To adjust the ringer volume setting, press the volume key when the phone is on-hook and idle.

Why is the light not coming on with a new voicemail message?

Your phone system or service provider must provide the visual message waiting service for this function to work. Check with your System Administrator for more information.

How do I find the IP address of my phone?

To find your phone's IP address, contact your System Administrator.

Why does my phone display the No Service message?

The phone displays the **No Service** message if the SIP settings have not been set up correctly. Contact your System Administrator for more information.

How do I change my user password?

You can change the user password from the IP phone UI or the Mitel Web UI. See ["Password" on page 83](#) and ["Configuring lock settings using the Mitel Web UI" on page 86](#) for more information.

Why does my phone display Bad Encrypted Config?

The IP phone displays **Bad Encrypted Config** because encrypted configuration files are enabled but the decryption process has failed. Report this error to your System Administrator.

How do I restart the IP phone?

To restart you phone, contact your System Administrator.
